Family Connections: A day of fun activities where bereaved families can meet others like them.

Forever Friends: Session for high school students who have lost a classmate/close friend.

Changing Classrooms: Classroom session grades K-6 after the death of a classmate/teacher.

FOR FAMILY CAREGIVERS: SUPPORT AND EDUCATION

Grieving Now: Individualized session for individuals or families facing an impending

Caring Well: Individualized session to preserve, kindle and liberate the spirit of the caregiver

Caring Decisions: Individualized session for the seriously ill for counseling and education on options. This unique program of the VNA gives families an opportunity to meet with a counselor to discuss and explore options regarding their health care choices when facing a serious illness of any kind. The counselor will listen to your concerns and provide information about the many services available from all agencies within your community. Your personal visit can occur at your convenience in your home, hospital, skilled nursing facility, assisted living facility or personal care home within our service area. Our counselors can dispel myths, reduce anxiety and facilitate informed decision making. This service does not require a physician order. Anyone can request this service and there is no fee.

Private Session: A support session with bereavement specialist for assessment and direction. Make an appointment to meet privately with a bereavement specialist for an assessment of your grief reaction and for education on appropriate resources for your situation.

Beyond Memories, Butterfly Release: Annual Community Memorial Service and uplifting Butterfly release

Women's Winter Wellness Retreat: Day Retreat for Women who have recently loss spouse or partner

Grief Support and Education Classes: Six session education and support program for newly bereaved

Holiday Grief, Surviving the Season: A community outreach program for those who are facing the holidays after a loss. These sessions generally take place in November and early December.
