1. **Adolescent Intervention Education and Support (AIES)** – An education and support program For adolescents struggling with issues related to drug and alcohol use.

2. **Butler County Substance Abuse Community Task Force** – The Butler County Substance Abuse Community Taskforce identifies community needs and works to meet those needs through organizations and individuals. The Taskforce educates our community on drug and alcohol related topics, initiates new programs, and assists in their implementation. The Task Force meets the third Tuesday of each month from 10:00 am – 11:30 am in the Butler County Government Building at 124 W. Diamond Street, MHMR/D&A conference room.

3. **Community Prevention** – A general prevention/education program offered through CCR. Prevention Specialists and Student Assistance Program Liaisons address various school and community needs for prevention services.

4. **D.A.R.E.** – Drug Awareness Resistance Education program for 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> graders in the over ten elementary schools in the county, presented by a representative of the Sheriff's office.

5. **Day Reporting Program** – An Intervention/Education program offered to adults involved in the probation system in need of drug and alcohol education/intervention. This program is designed to bridge the gap between incarceration and onset of treatment.

6. **D&A and MH Mini Grant Programs** – Each of the seven (7) of the school districts and one private school applied and received Mini-Grant dollars to conduct multiple prevention/education programs, events and activities appropriate to their schools and grade levels.

7. **Family Intervention Programs** – Two providers in the community (BMH and ISCMHC) offer Family Intervention programs for significant others and family members who would benefit from education and intervention regarding D&A issues.

8. **Prison Program** – An Intervention/Education program offered in the prison and at the Tier up to 4 times per week. This program offers drug and alcohol education and intervention to incarcerated individuals and houses the new **Prison Dialogues Program**.

9. **Reality Tour** – A volunteer-based prevention program focusing on the re-enactment of a day in the life of an addict; with a target audience of 4<sup>th</sup> through 12<sup>th</sup> graders and their parents. This program records a large attendance from the general public as well the target population.

10. **Recovery Advocates** – A grassroots recovery advocacy program whose purpose is to build skills, knowledge, and confidence for identified recovery community leaders and create awareness of and a sense of unity and connectedness with the larger recovery movement.

11. **Recovery Project** – A D&A Drop-In program for individuals in recovery from drug and/or alcohol addiction. This program offers social/recreational opportunities and education/intervention groups for program members.

12. **Stand Tall** – A school based organization/club that develops a positive peer pressure group in schools and in the community. Members vow to abstain from using drugs and alcohol, volunteer to participate in random drug screenings in order to prove it, and are rewarded for their healthy lifestyle choices through various incentive programs. Schools currently participating in Stand Tall include Butler Junior, Intermediate, and Senior High Schools, Karns City Junior and Senior High School, Moniteau Junior/Senior High School and South Butler High School.
